AN ORDINANCE MANDATING THE CREATION OF LOCAL SCHOOL BOARD IN EVERY BARANGAY IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF BINGAWAN, PROVINCE OF ILOILO.

Section 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as the "BARANGAY SCHOOL BOARD ORDINANCE OF 2018".

Section 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY. Section 1, Article XIV of the Philippine Constitution states that it is the policy of the State to protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality basic education and to make such education accessible to all.

It is at every level that governance of basic education shall operate – where the policy and principle for the governance of basic education shall be translated into programs, projects and services developed, adapted and offered to fit local needs.

In pursuance of this policy, the State encourages local initiatives for improving the quality of basic education. Officials and other stakeholders in communities are empowered to make decisions on what is best for the education of their constituency.

Section 3. CREATION AND COMPOSITION. There shall be established in every barangay a Barangay School Board which shall act as a component of the Municipal School Board with the following composition but not limited to the following:



- a) The Punong Barangay as the Chairperson;
- b) The Chairperson of the Committee on Education of the Sangguniang Barangay as the Vice Chairperson; and
- c) Members:
 - 1) Sangguniang Kabataan Chairperson of the barangay;
 - 2) School Head of each educational institution located and operating within the jurisdiction of the concerned barangay;
 - 3) Duly elected representative of all the Presidents of the respective Parents and Teachers Associations (PTAs) of all schools located and operating within the jurisdiction of the concerned barangay;
 - 4) Duly elected representative of all the Presidents/Chairpersons of the respective School Governing Councils (SGCs) in public schools situated in a barangay;
 - 5) Representative of the business sector within the barangay;
 - 6) Representative of accredited Non-Government Organizations (NGOs) and/or People's Organizations (POs) in the barangay;
 - 7) Duly elected representative of all the Presidents of the respective Supreme Pupil Governments (SPGs) or Supreme Student Governments (SSGs) in public schools situated in the barangay; and
 - 8) Duly elected representative of all the Presidents of the respective non-academic personnel organizations in the barangay.

The Barangay School Boards and their composition shall be formally created through an "Executive Order" by the Punong Barangay, the intent of their creation is to achieve the widest possible participation of "community based stakeholders in the delivery of public education services".

The term "educational institution" underscored in (c) (2) of this section shall be liberally interpreted to include all levels of educational services including elementary schools, high schools, pre-school facilities recognized by the Department of Education, technical-vocational schools, day care centres and tutorial centres and other alternative delivery mode of education.

SECTION 4. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES. The Barangay School Board shall primarily be a coordinating and consultative component of the Municipal School Board. The logic of their creation is that they would have first-hand knowledge of the actual operating conditions of every school operating within their jurisdiction and therefore they will be tasked to perform following:

- a) Make realistic and accurate assessments of the safety conditions of public infrastructures and facilities that the students are traversing on a daily basis like:
 - 1) The condition of public roads, streets and bridges;
 - 2) In consultation with the School Head concerned regarding the conditions of waiting sheds, pedestrian crossings, street lights, sports facilities and school infrastructure buildings; and
 - 3) The condition of pertinent infrastructure outside the school grounds.



- b) Make realistic and accurate assessments using their observations on public services like:
 - 1) The effectiveness of peace keepers such as the police and barangay tanods;
 - 2) The efficiency of pedestrian crossing aides;
 - 3) Traffic enforcers;
 - 4) Street sweepers; and
 - 5) School security and other school personnel.
- c) Initiate barangay activities or programs to enhance academic confidence and moral development;
- d) Ensure that the implementation of existing laws regarding billiard pool halls, computer shops, selling of liquors and cigarettes to minors and the like are being enforced;
- e) Formulate recommendations or alternatives to the realistic problems of the students being encountered;
- f) Under the supervision of the Punong Barangay, organize projects and other special activities within their respective barangay that can provide supplemental funding to the needs of the students;
- g) Collaborate with the Municipal School Board on educational concerns such as, but not limited to, the necessity of funding assistance for educational purposes;
- h) Provide support to the implementation of schools' policies, programs and projects;
- i) Establish community networks for education initiatives;
- j) Promote active private sector participation to the community's education initiatives; and
- k) Perform other functions as may be deemed necessary by the Board or as may be assigned by proper authorities.

SECTION 5. ELECTION OF REPRESENTATIVES TO THE BARANGAY SCHOOL BOARD. The PTAs Presidents, SGCs Chairpersons, SPGs or SSGs Presidents and Non-Academic Personnel Organizations Presidents in respective barangay are hereby required to conduct an election of their respective representatives to the Barangay School Board.

SECTION 6. MEETINGS AND DISCUSSIONS. All Punong Barangay are mandated to convene their respective Barangay School Board every month to accurately and completely discuss the provisions of Section 4 of this Ordinance.



The Punong Barangay is tasked to inform the Municipal School Board of the dates of their meetings and properly report the findings and recommendations of the Barangay School Board to the Municipal School Board.

SECTION 7. ROLE OF THE MUNICIPAL SCHOOL BOARD. The Municipal School Board shall assist the Sangguniang Barangay and see to it that the Barangay School Board is organized, trained and operational as a dynamic organization catering to the educational needs of their constituents.

The Municipal School Board will give great consideration to the reports of each Barangay School Board in the formulation of their policies, programs and funding.

SECTION 8. ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISION. The Municipal Mayor shall issue such other rules and regulations for the smooth implementation of this Ordinance.

SECTION 9. PENAL PROVISION. Any Punong Barangay or Sangguniang Barangay who wilfully or negligently fails to create, convene or fail to comply with the provisions of this Ordinance will be considered in dereliction of their duty as per Municipal Ordinance No. 223, Series of 2016, otherwise known as an "Ordinance Prescribing the Rules and Procedures on Administrative Disciplinary Cases Against Elective Barangay Officials in the Municipality of Bingawan, Province of Iloilo".

SECTION 10. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. The creation of Barangay School Board is not expressly mandated in Republic Act No. 7160, however there are no provisions in the Local Government Code that prohibits their creation and in an indirect way even encourages them. If any provision of this Ordinance shall be found to be "ultra-vires" or inconsistent with any national law and declared void by a proper court having jurisdiction, then the remaining unaffected provisions will remain in effect.


SECTION 11. REPEALING CLAUSE. All ordinances, rules and regulations, or parts thereof, in conflict with, or inconsistent with any provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

SECTION 12. EFFECTIVITY. This Ordinance shall take effect on the day following its posting in the bulletin board at the entrance of the Municipal Hall and in at least two (2) other conspicuous places in the municipality for a minimum period of three (3) consecutive weeks and after publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the Province of Iloilo.
