**MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 228
(Series of 2016)**

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING AWARDS AND INCENTIVES TO CENTENARIANS IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF BINGAWAN , PROVINCE OF ILOILO.

Be it ordained by the Sangguniang Bayan that:

Section 1. Title. This Ordinance shall be known as *Centenarians' Ordinance of 2016*.

Section 2. Declaration of Policy. It is a declared policy of the Municipality of Bingawan to pursue the objectives of R.A. 10868 or the Centenarians Act of 2016, particularly Article 5.2 of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of which, provides as follows:

“Article 5.2 Awards and Incentives from the local government unit. – A Centenarian shall receive the following awards and incentives from the municipality where he or she resides;

- a) Plaque of Appreciation - In addition to the letter of Felicitation, a Plaque of Recognition shall also be given to the Centenarian acknowledging his or her long life.
- b) Cash Incentive – Together with the plaque of recognition, the municipality shall also grant the centenarian a cash incentive in an amount to be determined by the LGU”.

Section 3. Coverage. All Bingawanons who have reached one hundred years old, whether residing here or abroad.

Section 4. Documentary requirements or Identification Documents. The Centenarian shall present his or her birth Certificate or Philippine Passport to prove his or her entitlement for the awards and incentives under this ordinance. In the absence of either of the two documents, any one (1) of the primary IDs may also be accepted.

- a) Senior Citizens Identification (ID) Card issued by the Office of Senior Citizens Affairs (OSCA) indicating the year of birth;
- b) Other Philippine-government issued identification cards such as Transportation (LTO) issued driver's license, social security cards like the Government Service Insurance System (GSIS), and Social Security System (SSS), Professional Regulatory Commission (PRC) license, Philippine Postal ID, Commission on Elections (COMELEC), voter's ID, etc. showing Filipino citizenship and year of birth as a reference point for the centenarian's eligibility for the awards and incentives.

Any two (2) of the secondary documents may also be accepted in the absence of the above-mentioned primary IDs:

- a) Marriage Certificate of the Centenarian issued by the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) or the Local Civil Registrar;
- b) Birth certificate of children borne by/of the centenarian;
- c) Affidavits executed by at least two (2) disinterested persons with personal knowledge of the centenarian's actual age or date of birth;
- d) Old school or employment records showing date of birth of the centenarian;
- e) Baptismal or Confirmation records of centenarian certified by the Church.

Any false attestations or certification issued shall be under the pain of penalty as provided under the Revised Penal Code, Civil Code and other existing laws for that matter. For the centenarians residing abroad, they may provide valid identification documents recognized in the country of their residence as verified and certified by the Philippine Embassy or Consulate.

Section 5. Administrative Provisions. The Municipal Mayor and the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Officer shall formulate and issue supplemental guidelines to operationalize and implement this ordinance.

Section 6. Appropriations. In the initial year of the implementation of this ordinance, the requisite fund shall be sourced out from the available funds of the MSWD Office and subsequently the necessary amount to implement this ordinance shall be included in the municipality's annual budget.

Section 7. Separability Clause. If, for any reason or reasons, any part or provision of this ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions thereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

Section 8. Effectivity Clause. This ordinance shall take effect 15 days after its posting in at least 2 conspicuous places in the Municipality and publication in a newspaper of general circulation.


