Resolution No. 04 - 2016

AN URGENT RESOLUTION DESIGNATING THE MATERNAL, NEONATAL, CHILD HEALTH AND NUTRITION (MNCHN) SERVICE DELIVERY NETWORK (SDN) COMPOSED OF PUBLIC AND PRIVATE PROVIDERS AND ASSIGNMENT OF PRIORITY FAMILIES IN THE SDN FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF BINGAWAN.

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Bingawan supports the attainment of Millennium Development Goals 4 and 5 which are the reduction of infant and maternal mortalities and the implementation of Maternal Newborn Child Health and Nutrition (MNCHN) program to address concerns and improve health outcomes related to MNCHN;

WHEREAS, the Department of Health (DOH) issued policies and implemented programs to address issues and improve outcomes on maternal newborn child health and nutrition to include the following: a) AO 2008-2009 – Maternal, Neonatal Child Health and Nutrition Strategy; AO 2010-0036 – Aquino Health Agenda and Kalusugan Pangkalahatan Execution Plan; d) the MNCHN Strategy Manual of Operations, 2011 (2nd Edition); e) AO 2012 – 0009 National Strategy Towards Reducing Unmet Need for Modern Family Planning as a Means to Achieving MDGs for Maternal Health; f) AO 2012-0012 Rules and Regulations Governing the new Classification of Hospitals and Other Health Facilities in the Philippines; and g) Department Order 2012-0120: Guidelines on the Execution of the 2012 Family Health and Responsible Parenting Budget for Maternal, Neonatal and Child Health and Nutrition Grant to LGU’; and most recently the h) Reproductive Health Law approved in December 2012;

WHEREAS, recently DOH’s launched the Universal Health Care Impact Five (UHC-HIF) Plan which focuses on five critical interventions: 1) reducing maternal deaths; 2) reducing infant deaths; 3) reducing under five deaths; 4) halt the spread of HIV AIDS and 5) establishing functional Service Delivery Network (SDN);

WHEREAS, the establishment of a functional Service Delivery Network (SDN) is considered as one of the key intervention to ensure that the first 4 indicators will be achieved and sustained. To guide the LGUs, the DOH issued Administrative Order 2014-0046, “Defining the Service Delivery Networks for Universal Health Care or Kalusugan Pangkalahatan” to effectively and efficiently cover the needs of priority groups and the general population in an integrated, coordinated and continuous manner;

WHEREAS, Service Delivery network (SDN) as defined in the MNCHN Manual of Operation as the network of public or private health facilities and providers within the province or city wide health systems, offering a core package of health services in an integrated and coordinated manner similar to the local health referral system;

WHEREAS, establishment of the functional SDN at the municipal level will ensure access to quality care for every mother, child and priority families in need of health services;

NOW, THEREFORE:

ON MOTION of Hon. Ted Peter P. Plagata, duly seconded by Hon. Nemesio A. Cachite, Hon. Eleuterio C. Patriarca, Jr., Hon. Lorens m. Belloga and Hon. Wennie P. Javellana;

BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, to favorably endorse to the Sangguniang Bayan the passage of a Resolution designating the Maternal, Neonatal, Child Health and Nutrition (MNCHN) Service Delivery Network (SDN) composed of public and private providers and assignment of priority families in the SDN for the Municipality of Bingawan and adopting provisions of this resolution to wit:

I. PURPOSE

The Overall objective for the designation of the Service Delivery Network within a broader public private partnership is to improve the maternal, neonatal, and child health situation on the Municipality of Bingawan.

II. FUNCTIONS OF THE MNCHN/FP SDN:

As defined in the DOH's Manual of Operations for the MNCHN Strategy, the principal function of the SDN is to deliver a core package of MNCHN/FP services consisting of high quality and integrated standard interventions that will be delivered for each life stage: pre-pregnancy, pregnancy, delivery and the post-partum and neonatal periods. These consist of the following:

1. Pre-pregnancy: Provision of the iron and folate supplementation, counseling on reproductive health/family planning and healthy lifestyle, provision of family planning services, prevention and management of infection and lifestyle-related diseases.

2. Pregnancy: First-prenatal visit at first trimester, at least 4 prenatal visits throughout the course of pregnancy to detect and manage danger signs and complications of pregnancy, provision of iron folate supplementation for 3 months, iodine supplementation and the tetanus toxoid immunization, counseling on healthy lifestyle and breastfeeding, prevention and management of infection.

3. Delivery: Skilled birth attendance, skilled health professional-assisted delivery and facility-based deliveries including the use of partograph, proper management of pregnancy and delivery complications and newborn complications, and access to BEmONC or CEmONC.

- A comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC)-Capable Facility (or Network of Facilities) and providers consist of health of facility/ies and providers that can perform the six signal obstetric function for BEmONC, as well as provide caesarian delivery services, blood banking and transfusion services, and other highly specialized obstetric interventions. It is also capable of providing neonatal interventions, which include the minimum the following: (1) newborn resuscitation; (2) treatment of neonatal sepsis infection; (3) oxygen support for neonates; (4) management of low birth weight or preterm newborn; and (5) other specialized newborn services. These facilities can also serve as high volume providers for IUD and VSC services, especially tubal ligations. It should also provide an itinerant team that will conduct out-reach services to remote communities. The itinerant team is typically composed of 1 physician (surgeon), 1 nurse and 1 midwife.
- A Basic Emergency obstetric and Newborn Care (BEmONC)-Capable Facility (or Network of Facilities and Providers consist of health facilities and providers that can perform the following six signal obstetric functions: (1) Active Management in the Third Stage of Labor (AMTSL) such as parenteral administration of oxytocin; (2) parenteral administration of loading dose of anti-convulsants; (3) parenteral administration of initial dose of antibiotics; (4) performance of assisted deliveries; (5) removal of retained products of conception; and (6) manual removal of retained placenta. These facilities are also available to provide essential Intra-partum. (1) newborn resuscitation; (2) treatment of neonatal sepsis/infection; and (3) oxygen support. It shall also be capable of providing blood transfusion services on top of its standard functions.

4. Post-Partum: Provision of post-partum care and post partum Family Planning based on informed choice and voluntarism, visit within 72 hours and on the 7th day postpartum to check for conditions such as bleeding or infections, Vitamin A supplements to the mother, and further counseling on reproductive health/lifestyle.

5. Newborn care until the first week of life: Interventions within the first 90 minutes such as immediate drying, skin to skin contact between mother and newborn, cord clamping after 1 to 3 minutes, non-separation of baby from the mother, early initiation of breastfeeding, as well as essential new born care after 90 minutes to 6 hours, newborn care prior to discharge, after discharge as well as additional care thereafter as provided for in the "Clinical Practice Pocket Guide, Newborn Care Until the First Week of Life".

6. Child Care: Immunization, micronutrients supplementation (Vitamin A, iron); exclusive breastfeeding up to 6 months sustained breastfeeding up to 24 months with complimentary feeding, integrated management of childhood illnesses, injury prevention and insecticide-treated nets for mothers and children in malaria endemic areas.

III. DESIGNATION OF THE MNCHN/FP SDN PROVIDERS

The following are hereby designated and confirmed to become part of the Municipal MNCHN SDN serving the priority groups assigned and the general population in the Municipality of Bingawan. They will form part of the MNCHN referral system within the municipality as defined with corresponding referral agreements and forms to be utilized.
